WEEK 1	Chat Questions Posted	<p>Questions used during #GlobalEdSsChat are created by different classes each month and posted on the <a href="#">GlobalEdSsChat website</a>.</p> <p>Common practice is for classes to answer the chat questions ahead of time using Google Docs, with a focus on learning a new form of writing, in consideration of a new, more global audience. Time during the chat is spent reading tweets, responding to others, and asking questions to further the conversation.</p>	Chat questions are posted the first week of every month and remain archived on the <a href="#">GlobalEdSsChat.com website</a> .
WEEK 2	K-12 Tweet and Talk	<p>Each month we invite students from around the world to join our @GlobalEdSsChat Student Leads as guest panelists for a short 20 minute <b>Tweet and Talk</b> (<a href="#">YouTube Live</a>). Students on panel discuss 3 chat questions, while K-12 students who are watching the YouTube Live <b>Tweet and Talk</b> to each other, and the students on panel. The remaining 40 minutes of the <b>Tweet and Talk</b> is then left for students to continue their conversations on Twitter.</p>	<p>60 minutes</p> <p>20 minute Hangout on Air with K-12 students watching &amp; tweeting + 40 minutes to continue the conversation</p>
WEEKS 2-4	K-12 Slow Chat	<p>Our Slow Chat is an ongoing Twitter Chat all month long following the Tweet and Talk. The Slow Chat provides K-12 students with more flexibility to share and collaborate at a time that's convenient for them.</p> <p>The recorded Tweet and Talk is available on the @GlobalEdSsChat <a href="#">website</a> and can be used as a provocation for the Slow Chat. As students consider new ideas, reflect on their learning, and/or develop new questions, they tweet using #GlobalEdSsChat to share and connect with others. <b>Join in anytime!</b></p>	3-4 weeks
